Concerning imitation this may be said: that there are 2 ways of imitating which are often mistaken coarsely '[grossly]'. There is an imitation of style and there is an imitation of matter. Only the last can properly be called imitation and as such held to be reprovable. For instance, Edgar Poe invented the detective story. But though it can be said of later writers in this same style that they imitated Poe in so far as they followed his example in a new literature, it cannot be said of them that they imitated Poe, unless they, willingly or unwillingly, transcribed his thoughts, or made us use of them.

Sometimes there is so deep an imitation of style that there follows an imitation of thoughts; and it needs acumen to distinguish this imitation of thoughts from the coarser and more direct manifestation. Yet an imitation so good argues an affinity of characters in the 2 writers, imitator or imitated. Thus Villiers de l'Isle Adam did not imitate Poe in thoughts but in style.
