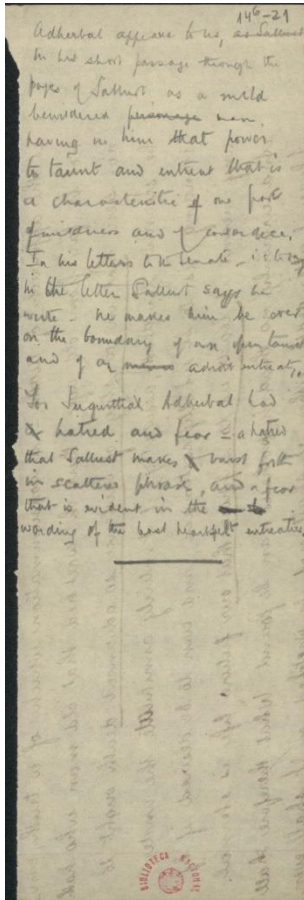

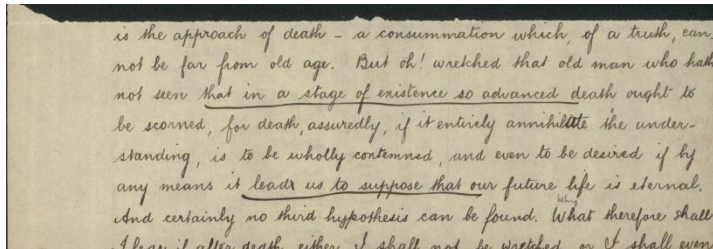
Adherbal appears to us, ~~as~~

in the letter Sallust says he wrote -
he makes him be ever on the boundary
of one open taunt and of an ~~mere~~
avoid entreaty. For Jugurtha~~t~~
Adherbal had ~~a~~ hatred and fear - a
hatred that Sallust makes ~~to~~ worst
forth in scattered phrases, and a fear
that is evident in the wording
of the least heartfelt entreaties.
