Beauty is the basis and the end of all poetry. But this beauty is three-fold, beauty of the idea, beauty of the expression, beauty of the form - of the verse in itself that is, of the music of it, or of the rhyme.

Mr. Swinburne's idea of art is based on a misconception, on a hasty and inaccurate consideration and reasoning. He speaks of, refers to ~~as be~~ only beauty of form, as absolute ~~music~~ beauty of poetry. He takes a part for the whole.

Immoral art is art without beauty. The ideas of good, of true and of beautiful are intimately connected. A poem in which the idea ~~is~~ was ~~so~~ beauty but not good is like a line which is unreal but has grammatical errors.
